

Planetary Health and Nursing

Planetary Health is an area of interdisciplinary specialization that is growing internationally. It was introduced in 2015 in the Lancet as a new way of looking at public health/policy making (Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, 2017). **Planetary Health** is a health field specialty that focuses on the human-earth relationship specific to health (Planetary Health Alliance, 2020). For example, one impact humans have made on the earth is pollution. Another example is urbanization. Although planetary health may seem very much like public health and global health, the differences are that planetary health includes resource consumption, politics, economics, and social systems (Johns Hopkins Bloomberg School of Public Health, 2017). Another example is to preserve farmland for the future. Human health and planet earth are intertwined. Nurses are key stakeholders in Planetary Health and considered a vital aspect (Kurth, 2017). For example, nurses are instrumental in areas of natural disasters, pandemics, health education, and lead poisoning prevention. In this growing area, nurses will begin or continue to receive further professional education about

the role of Nursing in Planetary Health as a key interdisciplinary practice participant. Stay tuned!
